DEPUTED CANDIDATES

The Candidates deputed by the Central/State Government/Autonomous Body/NGOs etc. for studying the BSW programme will have to undergo the selected procedure along with the other candidates.

ENVIRONMENT NUMBER

Every student admitted shall be assigned an enrolment number. The enrolment number given will remain the same for the rest of the examination and assignment. They shall quote full enrolment number in all the correspondence with the college. Students must write their enrolment number on their enrolment number on their assignment/examination answer books.

ADMISSION AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

- There shall be 6 (six) Semester Course of studies in social work leading to the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW).
- 2. Applicants who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent recognised by Manipur University from any discipline may seek admission in the BSW Programme.
- 3. Interested Applicants have to procure Application Form and Prospectus from the Institute. The application will be considered unless all the information sought in the application form in fulfilled.
- 4. There will be written test in the month of June every year as the first step to the selection of candidates, to be followed by the group discussion and personal interview. All tests will be in English.

ACADEMIC TERMS

- The institution will begin its academic year normally in the month of July every year as per the acadmic calender of the bachelor degree course of Manipur University.
- To be eligible to appear for the University Examination, every students is required to attend seventyfive (75%) of the lectures in each subject in each academic year throughout the three year course, unless otherwise specific in the regulation.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME:

The curriculum is divided into two categories:

(a) Theory (b) Field work

There will be four days theory classes (Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesday and half day on Thursdays) and two days (entire Fridays and Saturdays) of field work in a week due regard to agency timing.

THEORY:

The objective of the theory classes are to acquaint the students with:

- Knowldge of various discipline which contribute to the understanding of people in their Biological, Psychological and Social environment.
- Inter-relationship between the existing social system and their functioning and the manner in which they alleviate or obstruct optimal social problems.
- Problems that affect the individual, the group and defensive mechanism in the management of these problems.
- The technique and processes for identification of social problems through observation, analysis and assessment.
- Skill to select, plan and make suitable and realistic goals and to evolve appropriate strategies to realize these goals.
- 6. Ways and means for developing the ability for systems change rather than maintenance.
- Developing the ability for leadership, initiative and creativity for innovations and experimentation in the Professional Social Work practices and for scientific approach towards problem solving.

Field Work:

- 1. Feild Work is an integral part of the over all programme in Social Work Education. A student of Social Work Education goes to the field agency and practises the theoritical knowledge taught in the classroom setting under the supervision of trained field instructors. Field Work enables the student to see applicability of the theoritical knowledge to actual life situations.
- 2. It has a dual purpose of promoting the students' own learning as well as contributing alleviation of the problems encountered by the people with whom he/she Works.
- It has opportunity to the student to get an integration of class room learning and field practices and vice versa. It is in short, a feedback mechanism between classroom learning and field work learning.

Students will be required maintained recordings of the field work done during the course of their study. All students should dress soberly and appropriately when they go for field work.

ABOUT THE ACADEMY:

"The Ideal Teachers' Training Academy" (ITTA) is established in the year 2015. It is located at Sajiwa Jail Gate, Khongnang Makhong, Imphal East, Manipur. It is affiliated to Manipur University under the Vide No. MU/BEC/CDC/2013/167 dated 15th Dec., 2015. The Academy offers three years degree course in Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) from the academic sesson 2016-17. Now, two years B.Ed. course will also be started from the Academic Session 2017-18 within initial intake of 50 students.. The Academy is run under the aegis of Ideal Peoples' Society (IPS).

ATTENDENCE AND REGULATION

- 1. Minimum 80% attendence is compulsory for classroom instruction and 100% for practical.
- Every student must attend college regularly and punctually and performed satisfactory through the course.
- 3. Absence from class for one hour will be treated as absence for a half a day.

- 4. Absence from the field work for more than two days in a semester for any reason will have to compensate for the absence in accordance with the instruction of the supervisor concerned in consultation with the field work co-ordinator.
- 5. Prior permission has to obtain for absence from individual classes from the faculty concerned. Leave of absence in each case may be granted on the merits of the particular case. For leave exceeding one day, prior permission must be obtained from the Principal. In case of illness exceeding a day, a letter explaining the absenced must be sent to the Principal through the faculty concerned and a medical certificate should be submitted on the day the students reports to the college after the illness.

EXAMINATION

There shall be University examination at the end of every academic year. A student to be eligible for the said examination must fulfill the following conditions:

- a) 80% of attendance of theory classes on each subjects every year.

SYLLABUS FOR TWO YEAR B.Ed. (SECONDARY) PROGRAMME MANIPUR UNIVERSITY

Background and Guiding Principles

The present endeavour to revise the existing Syllabi for Bachelor of Education is based on the following considerations:

- * To meet the norms and standard for 2 year B.Ed. Programme of NCTE as endorsed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its judgement on 15th June 1993; and
- * To implement the stipulation of the Report of the High-Power Commission on Teacher Education constituted on the directive of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India under the Chairmanship of Justice J.C. Verma (August, 2012).
 - While developing the detailed of the syllabus, the recommendations and guidelines advanced in the following documents have been taken into consideration.
- * National Curricullam Frameworked for Teacher Education Towards Preparing Professional and Human Teacher NCTE, 2009;
- * NCTE norms and standards for Bachelor of Education programme leading to Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) degree two year course (Regulations 2014);
- * Curriculum Framework: Two year B.Ed. Programme of NCTE, December, 2014;
- * The Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.EL.Ed.) programme of study, Maulana Azad Centre for Elementary and Social Education, Central Institute of Education, University of Delhi; and
- * Syllabus for Two-Year Bachelor of Education, National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) 2012.

Besides, Curriculum Framework two year B.Ed. (Secondary) Programme prepared by the NCTE (2014), 2 year B.Ed. Curriculum prepared by NCERT and those of several universities in the country have been referred to while developing this syllabus.

In March, 2011 a General Body Meeting was held in the office of the society and the members of the society rigidly re-affirmed with a promise of begin to run a teacher's training institute.

With a full aspiration The Ideal Peoples' Society established an institute called "The Ideal Teachers' Training Academy" (ITTA) on the 24th November 2000 under the Registration No. 227/IE/SR/2000. This training Academy is situated at Sajiwa Jail Gate, Imphal East District of Manipur, in the Northern Side from the capital city and lies in the western side of the National Highway No. 150 which passes through Imphal to Ukhrul road. Its distance is 8 km from the heart of the capital city, Imphal.

The Ideal Teachers' Training Academy shines in calm and pacific zone. Its area is free from pollution and also an airy place. Consequently, it is a zone of Academic. The area of its campus about 1.85 acres. Regarding the security zone, it just lies between the Sajiwa Jail of Manipur situated in the Western Side & 38 Commando Coy, Assam Rifles, Chingarel in the Northern Side. Thus Trainee - Teachers' teaching and non-staff and visitors of the training academy will be free from any threat. It also facilitates well - equipped infrastructures which would be necessary for undergoing the BSW & B.Ed. As the institute just lies nearby (about 300 ft.) the NH-150, and public vehicles are also playing through this road so this offers the opportunity towards them to go to and fro.
